By engaging with the code of ethics, reflecting on personal values and motivations, and continuously refining teaching philosophy, educators can establish a solid foundation for their professional practice and contribute positively to the Early Childhood education field.

## Areas covered within the course include:

- · Understanding the code of ethics, where to find it, and how to use it in decision making
- Developing and evolving one's teaching philosophy over time
- Ability to clearly articulate the reasons for pursuing a career in Early Childhood.
